From May 6–10, 2019 the ministry is asking workplaces to participate in **Ontario's second annual Falls Awareness Week (FAW)**.

FAW aims to bring awareness to the falls hazards that exist in every workplace, through workplace discussion and participation.

During FAW, workplaces are encouraged to stop work for 15–30 minutes to have a safety talk about fall hazards specific to their work environment.

In 2018, FAW targeted falls from heights in construction workplaces. This year, the campaign is bringing attention to all types of falls in all sectors. Falls Awareness Week aims to create a positive change in workplace culture through the sharing of knowledge and experience. As part of a workplace's Internal Responsibility System, all workplace parties have a role to play in maintaining a healthy and safe workplace.



As of January 1, 2018, certain business activities that were previously classified under Class G –Construction, will be moving to a new class. For these business activities, certain obligations under the Workplace Safety and Insurance Act (WSIA) and WSIB policy will no longer apply. Click Here.
